Asbestos was used for walls and ceilings and roofs because it was cheap and easy to work with.






Where is it likely to be in my school?




Asbestos may be in the walls and ceilings of your school.

 - scratching names or words into walls
 - poking holes in walls or ceilings
 - picking it up and throwing it around.
